From this date, organisations will not be able levy a surcharge on customers for payment via debit or credit card. The costs associated with removing the card surcharge from the hackney carriage table of fares are minimal and can be met from within existing budgeted resources. There are no other financial implications for the Council. |
| Implications: | At the present time, the table of maximum fares and charges set by the Council in respect of the hire of hackney carriages allows vehicle proprietors to make a charge of up to 50p when receiving payment for a fare by way of credit or debit card, to help defray the interchange fees levied by the payment service provider on the payee. The Government are changing the law on such surcharges to prohibit them, from 13 January 2018. The table of fares therefore requires amendment to ensure that hackney carriage proprietors do not contravene the new legislative requirements. | |

Background

- 1. Section 65 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 allows district councils to fix the maximum rates, fares and other charges which are payable in respect of the hire of hackney carriages licensed by that Council, for journeys within their own area, by way of publication of a 'table of fares'. This power was last exercised by Dacorum Borough Council in March 2014.
- 2. Each hackney carriage licensed by the authority is required to have a taximeter fitted, calibrated and programmed with the maximum fares set by the Council, which will calculate and display the maximum fare payable for a given journey in that vehicle. Drivers may not demand a fare in excess of the amount calculated by the meter for a journey.
- 3. The table of fares also includes any other charges which may be levied on passengers by drivers. These currently include fees for large groups of passengers, the carriage of luggage, soiling of the vehicle, additional tools, tariffs or congestion charges, and a surcharge for accepting payment by way of credit or debit card. This last item was introduced in 2014 to assist drivers in offsetting the costs of providing card payment equipment, and the financial fees levied upon them by their payment providers.
- 4. In 2017, the Government consulted on the implementation of the second EU Payment Services Directive (PSDII), which among other items required national authorities to implement measures to ensure the transparency of surcharges payable in connection with the use of particular methods of payments, such as credit or debit cards. The Government's response to the consultation was to go beyond the European requirements on ensuring the transparency of surcharges on retail payment instruments by prohibiting them entirely. This proposal has since been incorporated within the Payment Services Regulations 2017, which will take effect from 13 January 2018.
- 5. In order to ensure compliance with this new prohibition, it will be necessary to amend the current table of fares to remove the entitlement to levy a surcharge on credit or debit card payments for hackney carriage fares.
- 6. A revised 'table of fares' is attached below, as Annex A. The removal of the card payment surcharge item is the only change from the current table of fares, all other fares and changes are unchanged.
- 7. The Council is already amending its own payment processes to remove such surcharges, to comply with the new legislation.
- 8. In Dacorum, hackney carriage proprietors are under no obligation to provide a capability to accept payment of fares by way of credit or debit cards, and it will be for individual proprietors to decide whether the commercial benefits of doing so outweigh the applicable costs, without the ability to levy a surcharge.
