Decision made and reasons:

To advertise and implement "THE BOROUGH OF DACORUM (ST JOHN'S WELL LANE, WATER LANE AND THE MOOR, BERKHAMSTED) (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2018 Traffic Regulation Order.

To help mitigate the reduction in available parking spaces in Berkhamsted during the closure of Lower Kings Road car park during the construction of the proposed multistorey facility on the site, the Order will introduce a change to a site designation in St Johns Well Lane car park, a change to maximum stay in Water Lane car park and introduce conditions to park in The Moor temporary car park. The parking arrangements are expected to be required from September/October 2018 to October/November 2019 however this is subject to change if construction of the multi-storey car park is completed prior to October 2019 or if there is an overrun.

The following amendments to arrangements in car parks in Berkhamsted are proposed to be made:

- St. John's Well Lane car park designation changed from segregated long (4-10 hours) and short stay (0-4 hours) car park to an any stay car park (maximum stay ten hours)
- Maximum stay in Water Lane, car park revised from four to two hours.
- Provision of The Moor temporary car park
