



# Holly Tree Court

## Supported Housing Scheme

Supported housing is accommodation for people who are aged 60 and over, who can live on their own but who would like to have support close by.

We have 33 supported housing schemes across Dacorum with a range of self-contained flats and bungalows. Social gatherings and activities are often available within these schemes.

Holly Tree Court in Adeyfield, Hemel Hempstead, is a purpose built supported scheme.

### Where is Holly Tree Court?

Holly Tree Court is off St Albans Road in Hemel Hempstead, it is a short walk to local shops at Queen's Square. There is a chemist, supermarket, newsagent, a café and takeaways, as well as the community centre. There are bus stops where you can catch a bus to the town centre.

The nearest doctors' surgery is Everest House, which is about 15 minutes' walk away.

### How many flats are there?

There are 20 self-contained flats in the scheme.

### What facilities are there?

There is a communal lounge, kitchen and toilet for tenants to use and there is a small car park. The scheme also has a small communal garden and a guest room for visitors.

### What activities do other tenants participate in?

This scheme has regular coffee mornings and the tenants use the communal areas for other social activities. We also run tablet courses to help tenants get online as part of our **Tenant Academy**, and a range of other free courses are available.
